
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The project reached a major public milestone this month with the launch of the final virtual public meeting in this phase of the project. The public is encouraged to visit the project website to review 3D visuals of the stations, route and overall bus rapid transit experience for a 30-day formal comment period (April 26-May 26). As of May 1 the project has had 1,184 visitors to the virtual public meeting.

Progress Underway with FTA

Over the next few weeks, we will be finalizing and submitting the required project management plans to the Federal Transit Administration, which will include schedule, scope, and budget, as well as detailed memos, models, station area plans and engagement records. Our coordination with FTA will continue to guide the direction of our project and we look forward to more direct involvement with the agency as we continue through this year.
