\$860,000 Grant Awarded to continue TOD studies:



The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) has awarded BCDCOG \$860,000 to continue planning for transit oriented development (TOD) along the LCRT corridor. The funding will be used to:

- Examine ways to improve economic development and ridership
- Foster multimodal connectivity and accessibility
- Improve transit access for pedestrian and bicycle traffic
- Identify infrastructure and affordable housing needs
- Enable mixed-use development along the future LCRT line



To date, LCRT has done a substantial amount of TOD work along the corridor. Since December 2018, the project team has held multiple community workshops along the corridor and charrettes with stakeholders, community groups, planners, and real estate advisors. From this engagement, the team formulated many documents to help guide policy in the area as it pertains to TOD: *

- Market Assessment Summary
- Value Capture Briefing Book
- Affordable Housing Briefing Book
- Real Estate Marketing Findings



In January 2022, FTA awarded approximately \$11 million to 20 projects in 12 states through its Pilot Program for TOD Planning. The goal is to support comprehensive planning efforts to **improve access to public transportation.**
