About the LCRT project

Lowcountry Rapid Transit is a critical component in the evolution of South Carolina's transportation infrastructure. This proposed 26-mile bus rapid transit system would connect the communities of Charleston, North Charleston and Summerville along the US 78/US 52 (Rivers Avenue) corridor. Bus rapid transit has comparable reliability, capacity and comfort of light rail but with the flexibility of a bus, and features recognizable stations, semi-dedicated lanes, pre-paid fare collection and technology advancements.
